Will I Be Next? A Reflection on Alzheimer's

For anyone who has a history of Alzheimer's disease in their family, the question, 'will I be next' can be haunting. Mark Vittorio, Fredonia, has had to reflect on this topic after losing his mother and grandfather to the disease. "Since I have a family history, I can't not pay attention," Mark said. "As I start to get older and something slips my mind,

in the back of my head I always wonder if this is the first drop in the Alzheimer's bucket."

Mark lost his mother, Adelle, in October 2020 after a 13-year battle with Alzheimer's. "You don't really know a lot about something like Alzheimer's until it happens to your family," Mark shared. "Of course, you know about it at a cursory level — you see commercials, or you hear about the Walks — but you don't *really* know about it until it happens to you. In some ways, it seems like it came on very quickly. My mom used to be so organized and meticulous. She was the one who remembered all the birthdays and took care of everything for our family. Then one day she just didn't. It was a real eye-opener."

"My biggest advice for families on this journey is to have patience," Mark said. "It's overwhelming and sometimes you just need to take a deep breath and take a step back. It's hard to appreciate unless you're going through it. One thing I'm grateful for is that my mom always knew her family, even up until the end. I've had friend's whose loved ones can no longer remember them and it's just crushing."

Mark and his family have been involved in the Walk to End Alzheimer's® in Ozaukee County for the last five years. "Originally, I didn't realize there was a Walk in our community," Mark said. "But when the opportunity came up, I wanted to get involved. Last year was tough since it was the first year my mom wasn't with us. But the awareness and funds that the Walk brings to the community is

so great and if it will help lessen the load for families on this difficult journey, then I'm in."

The Alzheimer's Association's 6th Annual Walk to End Alzheimer's in Ozaukee County is taking place on October 1, 2022, at Veteran's Memorial Park Bandshell, 410 N. Lake St. Port, Port Washington. The event opens at 8:30am with the Opening Ceremony at 9:45am immediately followed by the Walk at 10am. After the short walk, participants will enjoy a food truck and live music.

"This year's Walk promises to be a fun gathering for local families who are passionate about raising awareness for this devastating disease," said Terese Capizzi, Walk committee member and Alzheimer's Association Wisconsin Chapter board chair. "All the funds raised go towards free education and support services for Ozaukee families who are on this difficult journey. Come on out for the best party on the lake!" 



Mel's Charities has been supporting Ozaukee County coming up on 25 years, donating over \$1.6 million in grants to support intellectual or developmental disabilities, memorials and community impact. They have stayed true to their slogan "What we raise here, stays here," putting 100% of their net-raised proceeds right back into the community to help and serve others. Tom "Mel" Stanton is the founder of Mel's Charities, and he, along with his wife Nancy, says, "we sometimes reminisce about where it started and where we are now. We could have never imagined what it has grown into."

The story often told about how Mel's Charities started goes like this. In 1995 Tom and Nancy got married. Two weeks after the wedding, their good friends, who own the Cedars III bowling alley in Cedarburg, offered them a post-wedding celebration and the chance to watch the Browns play the Packers. Nancy & Tom attended a pig roast earlier in the year and thought it would be fun to include this theme for the party. Everyone had fun and asked Tom to make the pig roast a tradition when the Browns played the

Packers each year. The following year the team moved to Baltimore, so there was no need for another Pig Roast. Being a self-proclaimed "long-suffering" Cleveland Browns fan, Tom replied, "I'll tell you what, if the Cleveland Browns ever come back to Cleveland, we'll do it again."


In 1999 the Browns returned to Cleveland, and he held true to his word, hosting the second pig roast. Tom had a "light bulb" moment. he said, "halfway through the party, it dawned on me that one of our good friends in attendance had a sister who passed away; she was a single mom to a daughter with special needs." Tom felt moved to put together an impromptu raffle to raise money in honor of the sister and for her special needs daughter. Tom raffled off two signed miniature Packer helmets that he had in his car, he collected \$350 and donated it to the Special Olympics upon request of the family. Tom realized gathering his friends together for a pig roast could be an opportunity to have fun and help others in Ozaukee Co. by making it a fundraiser. So, the idea for Mel's Charities was born along with the idea for one of their largest events, the Mel's Pig Roast.





But there is another story that set up that fateful night watching football at Cedars. It's the story of how Tom met Nancy.

Tom was born and raised in Rocky River, Ohio. His family moved to Green Bay, Wisconsin, where he graduated from Abbot Pennings High School (where the nickname "Mel" was born). He went to college at U.W. Oshkosh, where Tom says he graduated "Summa Cum Lucky." It was a job opportunity that brought Tom to Cedarburg after graduation.



The timing was just right for Tom and Nancy to have both found their way to Cedarburg because it was here in 1989, at Maxwell's bar, that the two of them met. Nancy recalls, "We met on a Sunday night, and I never would go out on Sundays, but I had a friend going through a bad break-up, and I wanted to cheer her up." So regardless of the next day being Monday, she went out with her

girlfriends. Tom and the Cedarburg Mercs baseball team he played for came into Maxwell's after their game that evening, and they happened to be at tables next to each other. They struck up a conversation and hit it off. "It was meant to be," Nancy said. After talking that night, they set up their first date for the next week at Summer Fest. The couple says, "That was it; we have been together ever since."

The two stories merged in 1995 when they had their first party at Cedars. Tom

said, "So if Nancy and I had never met and gotten married, this thing (Mel's Charities) would have never happened."

It was not just the fateful meeting and party that Tom if referring to that made Mel's Charities happen. It is Nancy. "Nancy is the glue that holds this whole thing together," said Tom.

Nancy's name isn't on the charity, and she doesn't hold an official role within the organization, but she is a silent force behind the scenes. Nancy has been a sounding board for Tom, and he says she continues to challenge him to make the organization great. "She is going to tell me straight up if I have a good idea or not," he said. He also credits her with having many great ideas of her own for the charity over the years.

Not only does Nancy commit her time to Mel's Charities, but she also works at Sterling Law Offices. As a Family Law Paralegal, she supports families going through very emotional and often challenging situations, dealing with divorce, child custody, child support, and more.

Tom shared that up until five years ago, he worked full-time for the charity and at his Sales Executive position with American Solutions for Business. It was then that his largest customer moved all their operations to Mexico, taking about 80% of his straight commission sales with them. Tom was not collecting a paycheck from Mel's Charities, and he and Nancy found themselves asking each other and praying about their next steps. Finally, they decided Tom would commit to working on Mel's Charities full time. Nancy stepped in to support the couple on the home front so Tom could pursue his dream.

With that support from Nancy, Tom

has taken Mel's Charities to a new level. He is currently working on a project in Saukville being referred to as "Mel's Village,"

which will be a multidimensional community featuring retail, resident, recreational and green space. Visit melscharities.org to read an article from the Ozaukee Press on the full scope of the project.

The many ways Mel's Charities benefits Ozaukee County are incredible. Speaking with Tom, you can feel his passion and enthusiasm for the causes he is supporting and their current projects, but he says, "This is only the beginning; we are just getting started."

The Stantons individually and as a couple are remarkably inspiring. Tom and Nancy have a strong devotion to God, each other, and this community, and it is changing people's lives. The couple does not have children but says they have been blessed with "the largest extended family in Ozaukee

County through Mel's." And as Tom likes to say about their story, the donations they receive, and the countless ways they have been blessed, "You Can't Make This Stuff Up!"

OZAUKEE FAMILY SERVICES

Ozaukee Family Services (OFS) moved to Cedarburg from Grafton in February of 2022. However, the change in location did not change what they


do or who they help. Since 1974, OFS has offered education, enrichment, and support to young children, adolescents, adults, individuals, families, and seniors. OFS programs focus on behavioral health, family education and support, senior services, and prevention. All their services are free or on a sliding fee scale. No one is ever turned away due to the inability to pay.

The demand for behavioral health services continues to grow. OFS is expanding its programming to meet this need through counseling, youth groups, and programs such as Coordinated Services Team (CST). OFS provides counseling

in their office and in many area schools. Meeting children at their school offers many benefits including making it easier to access. The CST program assists families by fostering collaboration among numerous service providers to improve communication and work toward common goals. Without this team approach it can be difficult to have everyone "on the same page." A parent, teacher, coach, therapist, etc. may not be aware of various goals that have been set for a child or techniques/strategies that have been implemented. By collaborating, and incorporating a family's strengths and support system, they can work together to achieve agreed upon goals.

Family Education and Support includes free playgroups and workshops addressing a wide range of topics throughout the year and programs that focus on strengthening families. The Parents as Teachers program includes home visits to families with young children (0-5 years old). The program aids in a child's emotional, social, and academic development. It is beneficial to all families but is particularly valued by new parents, parents looking for fun, interactive ways to connect with their kids, parents who could use additional support, or anyone who wants to build confidence in their parenting skills.

The Family Steps program helps parents who are facing behavioral challenges by providing them with various strategies, techniques, and support to bolster their parenting skills to help reduce and prevent unwanted behaviors. For children and adolescents (K-12) who are dealing with major family changes such as divorce or death, OFS offers the Rainbows program. It seeks to provide a "rainbow" after the storm in a child's life by helping participants understand and express their feelings, build a stronger sense of self-esteem, and direct their energy toward a healthy acceptance of the changes that have taken place.



etc. Volunteers also assist with small misc. projects such as yard work or minor fix-it jobs.

The strong partnership Ozaukee Family Services has with area schools includes providing prevention education programs to students of various ages. Topics include internet safety and cyberbullying, eating disorders, protective behaviors, and suicide prevention.

Whether it's a single workshop or participation in an ongoing program, Ozaukee Family Services is committed to the wellbeing of all individuals and families in our community.

Special Olympics athlete turned reporter and mentor; Ross Rintelman, is always on the pulse of what is happening with the Ozaukee County Special Olympics. He started as a participant in 1990, competing in track & field, volleyball, softball, bowling & golf. Rintelman said he continues to practice his golfing skills at the driving range and continues to bowl as well.

One of his goals was to bowl a perfect game and during one of the Mel's Charities bowling events, he scored a perfect 300, accomplishing his goal. When asked what he loved most about his sports, Rintelman said, "being with my teammates & coaches, who bring me so much joy." Rintelman now writes a blog, Ross' Corner, for the Ozaukee County Special Olympics reporting on current happenings in the organization.

The Special Olympics doesn't just focus on training athletes for competition; they also focus on equipping participants with

life skills they can use beyond their sport. Ross said being a member of a Special Olympic team gave him "courage." What he has learned as a Special Olympic athlete has translated to the teams he works on at Wayne's Drive-In and Mel's Charities.





Now, as a mentor, Ross shares with athletes a few pieces of advice he was given when he was competing. He says to remember "good sportsmanship, play hard, respect all the officials, and have fun."

Ross enjoys spending time with his friends and family in his free time. He loves going on outings and trips and participating in activities with Portal Inc. (A nonprofit agency serving adults and youth with developmental and intellectual disabilities in Ozaukee County). Ross sits on the board of directors for Mel's Charities and Aging & Disability Resource Center in Port Washington. He also works parttime at Wayne's Drive-In.

Ross was enthusiastic about being a featured athlete this month but made a point of saying, "It's not about me. It's about serving others."
